Compatriot Christopher Fridley prepared a professional quality informational storyboard utilizing his artistic talent as a photographer to communicate George Washington Chapter's 2021 activities for the 2022 annual society meeting which was attended by more than one hundred fifty (150) Compatriots, wives and guests from Washington and Oregon, including two NSSAR General Officers.

Compatriot Fridley, with minimal direction, arranged a photographic montage illustrating George Washington Chapter activities that will be useful for many occasions to communicate who we are and what we do as an organization. Compatriot Fridley constructed an informational marketing tool that is outstanding.

In addition to the above, Compatriot Fridley also serves as Chairman Veteran Service Corps, a member of and drummer for the GWC Color Guard and is our Chapter Photographer.

The Washington SAR Meritorious Achievement Medal is awarded to recognize a significant meritorious achievement in support of the Washington society programs or activities. The medal depicts General George Washington a-horse in bronze relief with his sword raised in victory at the Battle of Trenton. It is taken from John Faed's famous painting entitled Washington Receiving a Salute on the Field of Trenton. The inscription reads Achievement and Washington Society S.A.R. The reverse is inscribed For Achievement with Merit. The medal is suspended from a drape in the Washington State official colors of green, blue and gold.
