

Subject: Fourth Quarter Activity Report for 2021 (dated: January 23, 2022)

Activities for the fourth quarter of 2021 are listed below. This summary does not address regular housekeeping activities but focuses on those activities addressing our missions of Patriotism, Education and History.

Awards – Chair, Mike Hutchins, reported activities in the fourth quarter were significant with four officers, Marshall Eberhart, David Stockton, Tom Oliver, and Kevin Coyne, receiving certificates and medals. Seventeen law enforcement members in Whatcom and Skagit Counties receiving Law Enforcement Awards, including our own Compatriot Jack Foster. Two county employees also received Bronze Good Citizenship Medals for their support of Law Enforcement activities.

Boy Scouts of America – Chair is C. Marshall Eberhart
